Reading Words (A)

- 1. I can use my knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes to read new words.
- 2. I can read exception words, noticing the differences between spelling and sound.
- 3. I can read independently using a range of strategies to decode and for meaning.
- 4.I can read aloud with expression, taking in to account ?! "". and ,
- 5.I can read most of the high frequency words for my age group.

Group Participation and Leadership (B)

- 1.I can listen to and discuss a wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books.
- 2.I can participate in discussion about books, taking turns and listening to what people say.
- 3. I am starting asking questions and organising reading in my group.
- 4. I can make choices about what text to read, using what I've read before to help me.
- 5. I can ask questions to improve my understanding of a text.

Selection and Retrieval (C)

- 1. I can use knowledge of the alphabet to retrieve information. (dictionaries, index etc)
- 2. I can summarise main points in a text, using the text to support me.
- 3. I can talk about how a character is built up with small details.
- 4. I can make predictions using my knowledge of the text and wider connections (e.g. what I've read before)

Text Organisation (E)

- 2. I understand why texts are organised in to paragraphs and chapters.
- 3. I can recognise some different types of poetry (free verse, narrative)

Word Choice (F)

- 1. I can identify where language is used to create an effect with a small comment.
- 2. I can think about what some WOW words might mean in context.
- 3. I can say how an author uses words to create a mood and build tension.

Writer's Viewpoints (G)

- 1. I can make a comment about why an author has written in a certain way.
- 2. I can give my own point of view on a text, drawing on my own experiences.

Context (H)

- 1. I can make connections with different texts that I have read. E.g. similarities in plot, topic, books by the same author.
- 2. I can recognise some of the contextual features of texts. (historical setting etc)
- 3. I am familiar with a range of texts both fiction and non-fiction and I can retell these orally at a level for my age.
