Ideas

- 1. I can plan what I am going to write about considering structure, vocabulary and grammar and consider the audience and purpose.
- 2. I can discuss how other authors have developed characters and settings.
- 3. I can note and develop ideas, drawing on research.

Organisation

- 4. I can orally organise and retell what I am going to write building in rich and varied language and a range of sentence structures.
- 5. I can select the appropriate form for my writing and use other similar writing as models for my own.
